WHO WE ARE

The JLM is an organization of nearly 500 volunteer women of all ages and backgrounds who live throughout the Miami area. Our volunteers include executives, community leaders, entrepreneurs, mothers, and professionals from a wide range of industries and backgrounds. We welcome all women who value our mission of improving our community, promoting voluntarism and developing the potential of women.

OUR MISSION

The Junior League of Miami (JLM) is an organization of women committed to promoting voluntarism, developing the potential of women, and improving communities through the effective action and leadership of trained volunteers. Its purpose is exclusively educational and charitable.

OUR MODEL

Central to the mission of JLM is the personal and professional growth of our members. We have been building the capacity of women leaders in Miami for nearly 100 years. Through trainings that build specific skills and volunteer leadership positions that contribute to holistic growth, our unique model places members in JLM leadership roles that mirror positions found at both for-profit and nonprofit organizations. Governed by a Board of Directors and managed by a separate Executive Management Team, JLM is a 501(c)(3) organization and our volunteer leaders promote diversity, build teams, steward budgets, and deliver impactful results. Our current and past leaders are executives across a wide array of industries in Miami.

OUR HISTORY

JLM has been training, developing, and empowering women throughout Miami-Dade County for 96 years. Throughout the League's history, the women volunteers of JLM have planted the seeds for many programs that are still part of this community today. Some have grown into major institutions, like the Children's Home Society (began in the early 1930s), the Phillip and Patricia Frost Museum of Science (started by JLM in 1949), and Inn Transition North and South (started in 1988 with Inn Transition North opening in 1990 and Inn Transition South opening in 2002).

The Junior League of Miami is one of 295 Leagues making up The Association of Junior Leagues International, Inc. Founded in 1901 by New Yorker and social activism pioneer Mary Harriman, the Junior Leagues are charitable nonprofit organizations of women, developed as civic leaders, making a demonstrable impact on their communities. In 1921 the Leagues joined forces to create an association to bolster their power and amplify their voice through shared knowledge and common causes.

True to their mission, today's League members work at the forefront of social reform, tackling the toughest and most critical issues of the day-including childhood nutrition and obesity, human trafficking, foster care, juvenile justice, teen self-esteem, cybercrimes, literacy and the environment, among others-for the purpose of enhancing the social, cultural, and political fabric of civil society.

INN TRANSITION

Inn Transition is a creative and vital answer to transitional housing for victims of domestic violence and their children. In a partnership created with Miami-Dade County, Inn Transition provides victims with housing, counseling, and services for a period of three to 24 months. DONE IN A DAY

Done In a Day is a signature JLM community project that assists local organizations with short-term events within the League's focus area. These projects and events can be accomplished in one day. THERAPY DOGS

JLM members, who are devoted dog lovers, and own dogs that have earned a "therapy dog" certification, participate in a unique reading program at select Libraries around the county - the Paws 2 Read Program. The purpose of the program is to give children the opportunity to get comfortable about reading out loud in public.

Often times, when a child is forced to learn, especially in an environment where the spotlight is on them, they may feel frustrated or get agitated. Interacting with the therapy dogs immediately calms children so they can start to learn. Timid readers begin to blossom when there is "creature comfort" within reach and it allows children to begin to express themselves without fear of judgment or failure. PACE CENTER FOR GIRLS, INC.

PACE Center for Girls, Inc., known as Pace Miami, is an innovative prevention and intervention program that addresses the needs of girls from the ages of 11 to 17 who have suffered trauma and as a result are doing poorly in school or at risk of becoming involved in the Juvenile Justice system. For the last 3 years, JLM partnered with Pace Miami by providing monthly activities that help build self esteem, improve academics, and empower participants to have a successful future.

ADVOCACY

The Junior Leagues of Florida State Public Affairs Committee (SPAC) has been the advocacy arm of the Junior Leagues of Florida for nearly 45 years, monitoring the state legislative process and addressing issues of political importance to our members. The Junior League of Miami's Advocacy Committee identifies issues that resonate with our members that are relevant to the Junior League Mission and develops strategies for tackling them. This advocacy takes many forms -- it can be as straightforward as building awareness and educating the public about a pressing problem or as ambitious as sponsoring and writing a bill that ultimately becomes a law.

The State of Florida boasts 22 Junior Leagues, with combined membership of over 11,000 women. Each Florida Junior League that chooses to participate in the advocacy process sends delegates to state meetings and conferences throughout the year to research and debate the issues of the day, and then:

1. Advocate for specific legislation at the state and national levels that is relevant to our key issue areas

2. Educate our member Leagues about advocacy and public policy

3. Coordinate the exchange of information from communitybased League projects to policymakers

Over the years, we have weighed in on various topics, including child safety seats (booster seats), bicycle helmets for children under 16, the Environmental Growth Management Act of 1995, the '911' Emergency Medical System, child abuse, domestic violence, juvenile justice, education, healthy foods and human trafficking.

INN TRANSITION NORTH CLOSING THE CHAPTER TO ONE OF JLM'S SIGNATURE PROJECTST

More than thirty years ago Junior League of Miami, Inc. leaders invested our capital for the purpose of providing housing to women and children escaping domestic violence. In the process, we became property owners and stewards.

Through those thoughtful plans and the time and care of our fellow JLM volunteers, we have changed lives. Over three decades, thousands of women and children have had a safe living space at Inn Transition North. Beyond creating a new home for these families, JLM volunteers have provided programming on topics ranging from improving nutrition to building resumes to creating budgets. Together, we have celebrated Mother's Days, Thanksgivings, and created memories building gardens and playgrounds.

This year, our ownership of the Inn Transition North properties ended in a sale to a third-party buyer with a longstanding commitment to affordable housing. Junior League of Miami has collaborated with Miami Dade County's Coordinated Victims Assistance Center to ensure each outgoing ITN resident secured safe housing. JLM financially assisted in the residents' moving process through a moving and housing grant offered to each of those women.

More than 30 years after the original investment in the property was made, the use of the proceeds from the sale will be determined with the same love and care for the women and children in Miami that prompted the beginning of the Inn Transition project back in the 1990s.

We sincerely thank each and every volunteer that has invested their time and talent for the benefit of the women and children at ITN.

FINANCIAL YEAR IN REVIEW

JLM had an extremely successful fundraising year as we transitioned from virtual events to in person fundraisers. In the fall, our volunteers organized a recordsetting Give Miami Day, collecting \$69,000, which was \$14,000 above our revenue goal. We collected \$11,200 in grants and our Donor Relations committee developed procedures for donor management and acknowledgement of gifts and initiated the use of DonorPerfect, a donor tracking software. Women Who Make a Difference, an evening affair in 2022, raised over \$114,000, which was a remarkable feat, especially considering that this was our first large-scale in-person event since before COVID. We also had the most lucrative Holiday Bazaar in recent years, which was generously hosted by Katie Lane-Arriola. Last but not least, the Archives Centennial committee continued to preserve our history while they brainstormed how to commemorate our organization's legacy of 100 years of service in 2026.

Each shift was themed and gave volunteers the opportunity to socialize while working The shifts included building hard! Thanksgiving baskets for Inn transition families, a "Wine Down" event sponsored by Domaine Souviou, and Cookie Decorating sponsored by Kristen's Confections. Volunteers had a great time while breaking JLM fundraising records.
